Pete Frates, a local Boston College baseball player known for co-creating the Ice Bucket Challenge, also battled ALS and participated in the 100 Innings event, adding further significance to the cause.

While outlets like <u>The Boston Globe have spotlighted this event</u> in the past, filmmaker Alex Koppelman offers viewers an intimate, unprecedented look into the emotional and human aspects of this extraordinary game.
